

## **COVID-19 regulations and suggestions.**

### **Entering the country**

Current regulations for entering the country should be checked before your departure in your country of origin. Due to the different pandemic situations around the world, some restrictions may apply to your country at the time of your departure. It is advisable in any case to check WHO recommendations for international travels (<https://www.who.int/news-room/articles-detail/who-advice-for-international-traffic-in-relation-to-the-sars-cov-2-omicron-variant>).

Currently, and as a general rule, Argentina Immigration Office is not asking for proof of vaccination but a legal document proving so could be asked by the particular Airline you are using for traveling. Many rules are applied upon departure or in any scale or intermediate stop, for which it is advisable to have a whole vaccination scheme applied and be prepared to show a legal document for proving so.

An Affidavit is required 48 hours in advance of your trip (<https://ddjj.migraciones.gob.ar/app/home.php>).

### **Conference on-site recommendations**

Considering the ongoing last developments of COVID-19 pandemics, world-wide heterogeneity of approaches to take care of citizens' health and cultural differences expectable in our community, we would rather recommend to behave in a very conservative way on the Conference premises.

Argentina has a highly vaccinated population with a low number of daily new cases and deaths. So the preventive measures have been relaxed accordingly. Some rules may change while moving to different regions in the country. Currently, wearing face sanity masks is required in public transportation, hospitals and some public offices.

Because of almost all attendees to the conference will be leaving the country immediately after its end, we need to emphasize that their trips could be spoiled if we do not prevent adequately the spread of any disease among participants, including COVID-19. Whenever you are not verbally communicating with other attendees it is advisable to wear a mask, especially in closed rooms and in presence of large audiences. Coffee times allow us to be more permissible, guaranteeing communication and fraternization by temporal suspension of its use.

A general rule of behavior would be: If you are not talking, eating or drinking, please use a mask. However, we just count on your free judgment and actions for achieving a smoothly developing and successful conference.
